ANTHEM NOTE

Ēriks Ešenvalds is one of the most sought-after composers working today, with performances of his music heard on every continent. Born in Priekule, Latvia in 1977, he studied at the Latvian Baptist Theological Seminary (1995–1997) before obtaining his master's degree in composition from the Latvian Academy of Music.

He sets this excerpt from Nelson Mandela's inauguration speech as President of the democratic Republic of South Africa with a simplicity of structure – verse-refrain format with an ending coda – and a rich, sonorous harmony that draws the listener into a fervent prayer for unity, peace and freedom that transcends time and place.

THE CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTIONS TO THE OFFICERS

- h. Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love? **I will.**
- i. Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people’s help to the friendless and those in need? In your ministry, will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ? **I will.**
